Guide for Pregnant and Parenting Students

(Last revised: Summer 2024)

The University of Miami (University) is committed to creating a culture of belonging for all students, including pregnant and parenting students, and does not discriminate based on pregnancy or related conditions or familial status, including in the admissions processes.

If you are a student experiencing pregnancy or related conditions, know that the University's Title IX Coordinator can coordinate specific actions to prevent sex discrimination and ensure you equal access to programs and activities. This document includes information about your legal rights as well as other matters you may want to consider in relation to your condition.

If you are a staff member or faculty member and need assistance relating to pregnancy, please review the University's Reasonable Workplace Accommodations policy and/ or contact <u>wei@miami.edu</u> or <u>facultyaffairs@miami.edu</u> respectively.

1. Contacting the Title IX Coordinator

We understand that whether and/or when to disclose that you are expecting a child is a very personal decision. There is no obligation for you to notify your school or any other school officials of your pregnancy. Furthermore, should you decide to notify them, there is no mandated timeframe for the disclosure. That said, notifying someone allows the University to assist you in planning ahead to best balance pregnancy and school obligations. Early disclosure can be particularly helpful in informing academic planning that ensures you continue to make progress towards graduation through your pregnancy, delivery, and beyond.

The University's Title IX Coordinator is the best person to assist you with pregnancy related concerns regarding your participation in University programs or activities. The contact information for the Title IX Coordinator is:

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2. Reasonable Modifications to Policies, Practices, and Procedures

Upon review of the individual needs of a student experiencing pregnancy or related conditions, the University will make reasonable accommodations to prevent discrimination and ensure equal access to programs and activities, including making reasonable modifications to policies, practices, and procedures if needed. Modifications that would fundamentally alter the nature of an academic program or activity are not reasonable and will not be granted. The University will engage with students and programs to ensure **reasonable requests are properly considered and granted when feasible based on the specific applicable class and/or program/activity requirements.**

Requests may include requests to reschedule exams based on medical need. If you need to reschedule a final exam, **do not** contact your faculty member directly, as this could compromise anonymous grading mechanisms. Instead, please seek assistance from the Title IX Coordinator..

Note that except in case of emergency, in most cases, students will not be able to make up work unless specific arrangements were made prior to an absence.

3. Leave of Absence

You are not required to take time off for your pregnancy or once your child is born. However, all students are permitted to take a leave of absence from their program should they choose to do so.

4. Lactation Rooms

The University of Miami provides Lactation Rooms on campus for individuals to express milk. This program is centrally operated for all individuals in need of the space, including students, staff, faculty, and affiliates. You may request use of on-campus lactation rooms through coordination with the Title IX Coordinator or directly through the Lactation Rooms Request Form.

As needed, the Title IX Coordinator can work with individual students to arrange for alternate spaces to be made available in your area, based on availability. Regional Campus students in need of lactation room access should contact the Title IX Coordinator.

5. Parking

To the extent possible, Parking and Transportation Services will work to accommodate special parking needs for pregnant individuals. Should medical circumstances warrant it, extended arrangements may be granted. Please note that requests are not guaranteed to be met, as parking is always subject to availability.
