## SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION

Seeking timely medical attention is extremely important. **In the event of an emergency, call 911.** If a non-emergency:

### **Roxcy-Bolton Rape Treatment Center**

Provides free specialized sexual violence treatment 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Obtaining treatment within 120 hours is essential to collect evidence and preemptively treat sexually transmitted diseases and pregnancy.

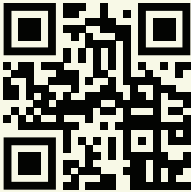
